## II. Progress Report

### Noise

Omya continues noise monitoring and remains well below permitted allowance. No new noise concerns year to date.

### Lost Trucks

- We continue to see lost trucks coming into the plant.
- Omya continues to contract with the Pittsford Police department and the Rutland Sheriff's department to patrol roads surrounding the plant. A total of 51 tickets were issued in 2016 to truck drivers for overweight vehicles on posted roads. Fines totaled over \$40,000.
- The amount of lost trucks coming into the plant is still a significantly small percentage compared to the total amount of trucks that pick-up from the plant ( $\sim 1-2\%$ ).

## Odor

• No odor concerns reported year to date.

## **Vibrations**

• There was one vibration/blast concern in February from the Middlebury Quarry. The ground vibrations measured were still well below the permitted levels that can cause damage.

## LNG

• Nothing new to report.

## Forest Management

- This project (cut) will help establish a healthy forest to sustain long term growth using the shelter wood theme and variation techniques. This will not be a clear cut.
- This is a proven forestry method for regenerating stands of tolerant and mid-tolerant tree species.
- The Forester for this project has over 30 years of experience.
- The work will be conducted over approximately 16 months and be completed in small sections.
- The noise modeling shows little to zero risk of increased plant noise at neighboring properties.

## Route 7 Roadwork

- The Segment 6 project consists of reconstruction of a 1.2 mile section of Route 7 and includes upgrades to utilities, sidewalks and street-scaping (including lighting).
- Omya, Town of Brandon & Casella Construction met with District #9 Coordinator Geoff Green in December to discuss temporary transportation options and process to amend permit.
  - If temporary changes to Omya feed stone hauling is needed, there will be scheduled public meeting(s) with stakeholders in Brandon & Pittsford to present options and collect feedback (Act 250 District Commissioner request).

## III. New Ideas / Topics

- Walt Ralph, second shift shipping coordinator, will be retiring in April. Lisa Ketchum has been hired to replace Walt.
- Due to concerns with speeding vehicles by Smith Pond, Omya is considering purchasing a speed radar sign to remind vehicles to slow down.

## IV. Next Steps (Action Items)

• Omya newsletter will now be issued once a year.

• A team member proposed to hold the Community Issue Team meetings three times per year. The meetings are running smoothly and do not see a need to meet quarterly. Team agreed to meet in May and again in the fall (late September time frame).
